Introduction

Uncovering the History of Every Shop in Stoke Newington Church Street

Over the years, I'd occasionally be contacted by new business owners in the street who wanted to know the history of the shop they moved into. As a local historian, I myself was often curious about what certain shops used to be, so in March 2017, I decided to trace and document the history of every shop in the street, which I knew would be an extremely useful resource once completed.

I began by manually copying the content of 24 street directories from the Hackney Archives into a spreadsheet. The snapshots jump by 5 years, starting from 1847. There was no need to capture every year, nor were street directories available for every year. The result provides a fascinating insight into how the street has changed since 1847, as many occupations and shops came and went over the years. In total, there were 291 addresses in the street. Some were and are still purely residential, some were lost over the years for various reasons, and today there are 123 commercial properties, including three purpose-built Public Houses.

Capturing and Organising the Data

I typed the data into a large spreadsheet (<http://bit.ly/amirstokey>) that contains a columns for the years, creating a horizontal timeline, and 278 rows for the addresses. Apart from showing the changes to each address, the research also includes mapping of old street numbers and present day ones (the street was renumbered in 1880 and then again in 1937).


While it may sound like an extremely tedious task, in reality I found it to be very engaging given the constant anticipation to see what happened to each shop in the next directory. Sometimes the same business continued for decades, sometimes the next generation takes over, and in other cases someone else takes over the business or a completely different one opens instead. I encountered many long-gone professions and occupations, some of which I didn't recognise so the task of typing the data into the spreadsheet offered many opportunities to learn something new.

Once the content of the street directories was in spreadsheet form, it made it very easy to search for certain names and business types for example. It's a resource that has been used by various people over the years, from local historians to family members tracing the address of an ancestor. The mapping of old numbers onto today's numbers is especially useful.

Historical Trends & Insights

The main benefit of having the data in a spreadsheet rather than print format was that, it presented fascinating analysis opportunities to explore trends, patterns and statistics about the street's commercial landscape, such as the rate of change over time, the change in occupancy rate over time and the average number of times a shop in the street changes. Here's a summary of the analysis as of November 2025:

- Total businesses on the street since the 1840s: **1,891**.
- Average number of shop changes: **11**.
- Average trading duration: **9 years**.
- Longest continuously trading business today: **No. 9 Gino's Barbershop (opened 1965)**.
- Longest continuously trading business ever: **Nos. 32-40 Whincop & Son, Timber merchants (1876-1998)**.
- Average rate of change over 7-10 year period since 1890: **54%**.
- Highest rate of change: **75% in the 1980s**.
- Lowest rate of change: **45% in the 1910s**.
- Average occupancy rate: **91%** (92% currently).
- Lowest occupancy rate: **63% in 1946**.
- Highest occupancy rate: **98% in 2001**.



The data enabled the analysis of various trends, such as the number of certain business types on the street over the years.

The History of Every Shop in Stoke Newington Church Street

Reading through the timelines of the various shops over the decades, it becomes clear after a while that some business types are always around, like grocers and hairdressers, because there's consistently been demand for them, while others appear and then disappear, often peaking at a point in time and then declining till they vanish (tailors and shoemakers, for example).

One analysis I carried out involves looking at the total number of businesses by type. The table below shows the number of businesses per type since 1847 and also the percentage they represent out of the 1,891 total number of businesses that have traded in the street during that period.

Studying the data, it's not surprising that confectioners top this list, though it's not exhaustive of all business types. In 1937 alone, there were 15 different confectioners operating in the street.

The History of Every Shop in Stoke Newington Church Street

Despite the impression some people might have that today's Stoke Newington Church Street is dominated by cafes, estate agents, restaurants, and lifestyle shops, in reality, as of November 2025, all of these types of businesses make up only 31% of the 108 businesses trading currently.

There's more retail and services than people are sometimes aware of, with a considerable number of one-offs: Bakery, Chemist, Butcher, Card shop, Jeweller, Violin shop, Mini cab, Nail bar, Cycle shop, Fishmonger, Ice cream shop, Hardware shop, Dog grooming, Locksmith, Dog accessories, Kitchenware, secondhand bookshop, Violin shop, Nursery, Electrical goods repair, Post Office, Workshops, Japanese knives & equipment, Dental surgery, Travel/Shipping agents and an Event Space Hire.

How This Book Is Organised

The book opens with a section titled '*Street View*', offering a street-level snapshot of the present-day shops as they appeared in **1890**, **1925**, **1954**, **1984** and **2015**, providing an at-a-glance sense of the area's commercial landscape over time. This is followed by a detailed history of each shop on Stoke Newington Church Street, presented in two sections that mirror their physical layout along the street. The first focuses on the south side (odd numbers), covering **72 shops**, followed by the north side (even numbers), which includes **53 shops**.

The three purpose-built Public Houses (Red Lion, Rose & Crown, Clarence Tavern) are not included, as I didn't deem them relevant for this book since they change owners over time but not business type. Only commercial properties that exist today are included. In the 1890s, there were **154** commercial properties; today, there are **123**, as some shops were demolished over time. There are a few instances of double-fronted shops that were once separate. Hence, while there are a total of **123** existing commercial properties in Stoke Newington Church Street (including purpose-built Public Houses), there are a total of **125** shops listed in this book, as shops are listed individually to show their history before they were merged.

The timespan for most shops is from the **1870s** to the present. Using 24 street directories, I have referred to decades for each business due to the lack of exact years. Some shops changed frequently, while others saw few changes. You'll notice that some shops remained similar apart from name changes, while others had a complete mix of business types over the decades. There are many interesting patterns and insights you'll enjoy spotting as you read through the evolution of each shop.

Did You Know?

There have been 61 different confectioners in Stoke Newington Church Street since the 1840s, which accounts for 3.3% of the 1,844 businesses in the street during that period. In 1937, there were 15 confectioners on Stoke Newington Church Street. Over time, confectioneries merged with newsagents, tobacconists, and stationers, which used to be separate shops, to form what we know today as the Off-Licence or Post Office.

Increasing awareness over the years of the impact of sweets on dental hygiene may also have contributed to the demise of dedicated confectionery shops, though there may have been additional factors.

Did You Know?

No. 103 Stoke Newington Church Street is one of only two shops that have never changed business type, the other being No. 100, which has been a chemist since the 1860s. No. 103 has continuously been a wine shop since the 1880s, albeit under different owners and names throughout the years.

Analysing the data for the entire street, there are many examples where a shop changes hands several times over decades, with only the name changing while the business type remains the same. For example, there have been five different butchers at No. 14 since the 1910s until the present day. However, there are cases where the name or brand was retained due to familiarity and loyal customers.

Often, a shop changing hands but remaining the same business type is due to the fixtures and fittings already being in place, making it ready for immediate use.



Did You Know?

Some businesses have moved to a different shop on the street. This can happen for various reasons, such as when the rent is hiked and there's an opportunity to relocate and stay on the street at more favourable terms, or when a business is looking for larger premises.

Examples:

- Fenn Edwin, Leather seller, moved from no. 22 to no. 37 in the 1910s
- Olive Loves Alfie, Children's' clothing, moved from no. 84 to no. 111 in 2020
- G K Locksmiths moved from no. 45 to no. 50 in 2021
- Early Bird, Cards & Gift shop moved from no. 86 to no. 3 in 2017
- Kitchen Provisions, Japanese knives & equipment, moved from no. 134 to no. 92 in 2023

Did You Know?

No. 46, KAC Builders Merchants, is the shop on Stoke Newington Church Street that has changed the fewest number of times, with just one change. It was John Weeden's Oil shop before that since the shop was built. In comparison, No. 15 has changed 18 times to-date.

KAC is also the longest-running business in the street, though not the continuously longest-running, as it has changed hands since opening in 1951. It was opened by Sid Katz; 'Kac' is the Polish spelling of the Yiddish/German surname meaning 'cat'. Asaf Rifat (1946-2022), who worked there since his late teens, took over the shop in 1989, which is now run by his son, Grant.




Ice cream cups, circa 1920, when 94 Stoke Newington Church Street was home to City Confectionery Stores, run by the Willett family from the 1910s through to the 1950s. The shop was known as The White Shop, likely due to its white-painted shopfront. These cups were discovered in 1985 in the loft of the flat above the shop, and were shared with me by Alison Kelly in late December 2025, after I posted on social media that I had deciphered the wording on a partially visible old sign uncovered during renovation, which read 'The White Shop'.

Did You Know?

Since the 1890s, the average rate of change over a period ranging from 7 to 10 years has been 53%, indicating that roughly every 10 years, half the businesses in Stoke Newington Church Street change. This trend has remained fairly consistent since the 1890s, with a peak of 75% during the 1980s.

It may appear that in the past, businesses traded for longer periods and there was less churn, but the reality is that throughout the street's history as bustling shopping streets up to the present day, some businesses lasted for decades, while others were only around for a year or two.
